

**JEFFERSON COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS’  
PROCEEDINGS  
May 22, 2017**

At 9:02 A.M., Chair Reed called the regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors to order.

Board members present were: Richard C. Reed, Chairman; Dee Sandquist, Vice-Chair; Lee Dimmitt, Supervisor.

It was moved by Sandquist that the minutes for the May 15<sup>th</sup>, 2017 meeting be acknowledged. All “Aye”. Motion carried.

It was moved by Dimmitt that the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors approve the Liquor License for Fairfield Arts & Convention Center. All “Aye”. Motion carried.

It was moved by Dimmitt that the uncollectable taxes from a prior owner’s mobile home, which normally would be assessed against the following:

are hereby abated, for the above amount. All “Aye”. Motion carried.

Supervisors met with the County Engineer.

Public Comment: Terry Winn asked the Supervisors to consider adopting a local preference policy.

It was moved by Dimmitt that the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors approve the Liquor License for Cedar Valley Winery. All “Aye”. Motion carried.

Dimmitt made a motion to approve the Murphy Motor Grader bid at \$189,392 for a 2017 Deere 670 GP purchase in FY2018 by Secondary Roads. Dimmitt “Aye”. Reed “Aye”. Sandquist “Nay”. Motion carried.

Supervisors discussed the proposed Statement of Understanding for SEIL county designated employees.

The Board discussed the nuisance property at 1008 Oakwood Drive.

Sandquist reported on her Early Childhood meeting. Dimmitt reported on his KMCD Spotlight Show interview.

Public comments: Chris Estle, Public Health Nurse, reported that the Board of Health voted for all public health employees (including Dan Miller) to forego raises.

It was moved by Sandquist to allow the claims against the county and to direct the county auditor to issue checks against the various funds of the county in payment of the claims allowed. All "Aye". Motion carried.
